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Genesis 3:23-24 ²³ therefore the LORD God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken. ²⁴ So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life.

Genesis 4:3 In the course of time Cain brought to the LORD an offering of the fruit of the ground

Genesis 8:20-21 ²⁰ Then Noah built an altar to the LORD, and took of every clean animal and of every clean bird, and offered burnt offerings on the altar. ²¹ And the LORD smelled a soothing aroma



• Jesus has: PASSED THROUGH THE HEAVENS

Just as the Aaronic high priest went through the veil into the earthly Most Holy Place, so Christ has entered into the very presence of God in heaven itself. 'Who has gone through' translates a Greek perfect participle and signifies the continuing validity of Christ's having entered God's presence. The access to the Father that He has obtained is a present and a continuing reality for His people. Cockerill, NICOT Commentary on Hebrews

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Jesus: GIVES ACCESS TO THRONE OF GRACE

- Under the Old Covenant none could approach God's "throne," the Ark of the Covenant in the Most Holy Place, except for the high priest, and he but one day in the year. This annual approach was with great fear because God's throne was the place of judgment against sin.
- Now, however, God's people are urged to draw near to the true heavenly "throne" of God with confidence because their High Priest has made that throne a throne of grace, a true mercy seat, for those who approach God through Him.

Hebrews 4:14:

Because we have a Great High Priest (therefore) let us hold fast our confession.

Hebrews 4:15-16:

Because we also have a fully sympathetic High Priest...

therefore let us come with confidence to find help in time of need.
