Call on people

What did Jacob say to his sons in Genesis 49:1?

Father avowel and I will tell you what will happen to you : CSB in the days to come NKJ - in the last days  
NLT in the future

What was declared by Moses in Deuteronomy 4:30?


When you are in distress and all these things have happened to you, you will return to the Lord your God in later days + obey His voice  
NET - in the latter days / NLT - you will finally return

What was Daniel told in Daniel 10:14?

I have come to make you understand what is to happen to your people in the last days (ESV - in the latter days) NIV - in the future  
for the vision refers to those days

The prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Hosea also used the same phrase as they foretold the events of the last days. There are many parallels between their words and Micah's.

Let's try to make a simple timeline to wrap our minds around what might feel like time-travel!



- Mark **CREATION**: the point of Genesis 1:1 "in the beginning," the creation of the heavens and the earth.
- Mark the general space where the **LAST DAYS (END TIMES)** will occur. (We will be more specific in a later timeline.)
- Divide the timeline into **THIS PRESENT WORLD** and **THE WORLD TO COME**.

I know there are many events in history and in the future that we haven't mentioned! We will add to this timeline - later. (It seems like everything is going to happen later!)
