What do we learn about the characteristics and reign of the Messiah, Jesus, the King of the Jews according to Micah 5:2-4?

Micah 5:2 - He comes out of Bethlehem

Micah 5:2 - He comes forth to be Ruler over Israel for the Lord

Micah 5:2 - His origins are from old, from ancient days

Micah 5:3 - The remnant of His brothers will return to the people of Israel

Micah 5:4 - He will Stand + Shepherd His flock in the strength of the Lord

Micah 5:4 - They (His flock, the people of Israel) will live Securely

Micah 5:4 - He will be great to the ends of the earth
