

Job 23:10 But He knows the way that I take; When He has tested me, I shall come forth as gold.

Qesitah – a piece of silver or gold; 100 qesitahs bought large piece of real estate; 1 qesitah was a generous gift **Ring of gold** – nose ring or earring



Job 42:9-12 So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite went and did as the LORD told them; and the LORD accepted Job. 10 And the LORD restored the fortunes of Job when he prayed for his friends, and the LORD increased all that Job had twofold. 11 Then all his brothers, and all his sisters, and all who had known him before, came to him, and they ate bread with him in his house; and they consoled him and comforted him for all the adversity that the LORD had brought on him. And each one gave him one qesitah and each a ring of gold. 12 And the LORD blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning

What did the Lord do for Job?

Did God owe Job?

James 5:10-11 ¹⁰ My brethren, take the prophets, who spoke in the name of the Lord, as an example of suffering and patience. ¹¹ Indeed we count them blessed who endure. You have heard of the perseverance of Job and seen the end *intended by* the Lord -- that the Lord is very compassionate and merciful.

- James' emphasis is on what the Lord did for Job.

Did God owe Job?

"God in His wisdom chooses to restore Job to his previous good life and even more. Such a restoration is a way of showing that Job has done the right thing. It would be wrong however, to suggest that this is the way God will act with everyone. If we were to take this as a pattern by which God behaves, we would be as guilty of putting God in a box as the human characters of the book were throughout." Tremper Longman

How did Job receive God's blessings?

- -gave grace, mercy, and blessing to those around him
- -prayed for his friends who had condemned him
- -welcomed his family and friends who had abandoned him
- -had an intimate relationship with his wife, raising 10 more children together
- -so generous that he gave his daughters an inheritance
- -humble toward others
- -so blessed by God that he became a blessing to others
