The Purpose of the Music: *to encourage you, Rev. 1:3 – the promise of blessing*

with assurance of salvation so that you will be able to look forward to the future that Jesus has revealed for His followers.

with excitement about the victorious return of Jesus.

to hold fast to Jesus right now in the trials of our lives

to be more devoted to the Lord and pursue godly living that glorifies Him.

to see who Jesus is and what He is going to do.

The Sounds of the Symphony

The Melody: *There is a Redeemer, Jesus – God's own Son; Precious Lamb of God, Messiah, Holy One.*

Genesis 3:15

Trombones herald the Messiah Psalm 2:6, Psalm 45:6, Psalm 110:1

Violins play sounds of the suffering of Christ Isaiah 53:3-5

French horns announce the arrival of the One who is worthy Gen. 49:10, Rev. 5:5

Timpani drums sound the Day of the Lord Joel 1:15

Dischord presents the forces of evil Rev 13, Zech 1:8

Cellos and bassoons add the prophecies announced by Jesus, Paul, and Peter

Didgeridoo and the theremin – add the unusual elements of events that strange and hard to understand

The Composition of the Symphony

1st Part – an introduction, Jesus is described

2nd Part – repeated descriptions of Jesus, with warnings and promises to the churches

3rd Part – the longest part: begins with a glorious march in the throne room, then presents judgments, explanations, and previews of the victory of the Lamb

4th Part – begins with war, then changes to peace and joy, until discord enters in again, and war

The symphony concludes after a dramatic pause – with beautiful sounds, new instruments join the old, and perfect harmony will sound throughout eternity
